## Safe Body Art Act Body Art Practitioner Registration Requirements

To perform body art, a person shall register with the local enforcement agency (H&SC 119306).

- 1. Submit a Body Art Practitioner Registration Application and provide the following:
  - a. Evidence of annual completion of OSHA Bloodborne Pathogen Training consistent with the Safe Body Art Act H&SC 119307 and Title 8 of California Code of Regulations (OSHA bloodborne pathogen standard) through Santa Cruz County approved trainer.   - b. Self-certification of, knowledge of, and commitment to meet state law and relevant local regulations pertaining to body art safety.
  - c. First time registrants may be required to show evidence of at least six months of related experience.
  - d. Practitioner's business address and the address at which he or she will perform any activity regulated by this chapter.
  - e. Payment of the annual registration fee to the local enforcement agency. An invoice will be mailed to the practitioner annually. \*All permits expire annually on the last day in December.
- 2. The following items must be verified by Santa Cruz County Environmental Health:
  - f. Evidence of current Hepatitis B vaccination, including applicable boosters, unless the practitioner can demonstrate Hepatitis B immunity <u>OR</u> has complied with current federal OSHA Hepatitis B vaccination declination requirements (declination form may be requested from this agency).
  - g. Proof that the practitioner is 18 years of age or older.

In addition, the following information pertains to body art practitioner registration:

- 3. Practitioner must display in a place readily visible to the public at the body art facility where the practitioner performing body art, current registration with the local enforcement agency.
- 4. Practitioner registration shall be renewed annually.
- 5. Practitioner must obtain all necessary permits, business licenses, and registrations required for the location in which they perform body art.
- A valid and current registration issued by a local enforcement agency shall be valid in a
  permitted facility in any other California jurisdiction for no more than 5 consecutive days, or
  15 days total, in any one calendar year.
